A new law just passed in Maryland, and...
Changing facilities for the personal care needs of adults may be coming to a public building near you!

WHAT DOES THE LAW (SB61/HB321) SAY?

Beginning October 1, 2022

- If a new public building is built
 OR
- If a public restroom is built in a public building
 OR
- If a public building is renovated (fixed or changed)

The building MUST have at least one changing facility for adults.

WHAT IS A PUBLIC BUILDING?

A building or area owned or leased by the State or local government.

SOME EXAMPLES ARE:

- A public mass transportation place like an airport or train station.
- A building in a public area where people gather like a public park or recreation center.
